

# Who is this leadership programme for?

SLP is for senior leaders, at or near the top of their organisations (could be in business, government, public sector or NGO, could be small or large), who want to hone their skills as leaders making a difference.

We attract individuals in roles that offer them a degree of autonomy requiring them to make decisions about impact, methods of influence, strategy and priorities.

# What is on offer at Module A?

**Powerful conversations** get you to think about your leadership in an ever-changing world with specific reference to challenges in your company/country/sector.


You work with **Tools** (including Power of Communication, Appreciative Inquiry, Transformational Leadership, Systems Thinking, Whole System Mobilisation) to strengthen you and enrol stakeholders inside and outside with a focus on the triple bottom-line of impact (people, profit and planet).

You develop **Breakthrough Initiatives** to deliver specific results towards a stretched vision of success of an identified challenge. These enable you to take up the leadership that is invested in you to make long-lasting sustainable impact.

You form new **Networks** for ongoing learning with accountability for mutual support. After the module through working, linking and learning together you can start to build a new **Leadership Community** locally.

Also through **Conversation Spaces** you can connect with members of a global community that is over 500 leaders strong.

**Module B** "Systemic Mentors" is an optional next step.



#### Towards a new Leadership Award

Middleground has developed with British Council a pathway that can earn you an award ("practitioner in intercultural leadership") as you bring your learning into practice 3-6 months after Module B. You bring evidence of your developing competence in:

- 1. Leadership self-awareness
- 2. Enrolling across boundaries, cultures and hierarchies
- 3. Transformative results and impacts
- 4. Taking systems and complexity seriously
- 5. Mentoring to spread leadership and learning.

#### **Dates and Options**

Module A is offered on DATES TBC, giving an option to enter Module B the following week DATES TBC. Options include:

- 1. Enrol for Module A only
- 2. Enrol for Modules A and B back to back
- 3. Enrol for Module A in TBC and Module B in TBC

#### Costs

- Module A: £750 per person
- Module B: £800 per person

The fee includes 3 days tuition including materials, meeting room and lunch (but exclude travel and accommodation).

An early bird reduction of £50 will apply to those who register and pay their full fee before TBC.
